


...contacts between a child and an adult or other person significantly older or in a position of power or **control** over the child, where the child is being used for sexual *stimulation* of the adult or other person.





negative impact than any One







If a child placed in your home does not have a history of sexual abuse, the child may not have been abused, or the child may not have disclosed the abuse yet.



Potential indicators of sexual abuse or exposure to a sexualized environment include lack of trust, depression or anger, and sexual behavior problems.



Caregivers can help ensure the safety and well-being of children by stressing and teaching about privacy.
