- Talk openly






- Encourage positive feelings








## **Barriers to Post Adoption Services**

<ul> <li>Inability to find needed services</li> </ul>	43%
<ul> <li>Providers who don't understand adoption</li> </ul>	39%
<ul> <li>Services that cost too much</li> </ul>	33%
<ul> <li>Providers who don't accept Medicaid</li> </ul>	30%

Effective and accessible post-adoption services are critical to ensure permanency through adoption.

## Advantages for Adoptive Parents



- Is there a safety risk?
- Will this create additional trauma for my child?
- Are we unable to maintain appropriate boundaries?
- Is the birth family unsupportive of me?
