

Empowering Through Action

The following programs are offered, at no cost to our families, to inspire enduring support and connections for current and former foster youth.

BUILDING CONNECTIONS AND CHANGING LIVES:

Foster Care: NOAS staff will provide guidance throughout the entire foster parenting process, helping you succeed for years to come.

TBRI® and CORE Teen: NOAS offers Trauma-Informed Parenting programs that help caregivers and professionals understand the impact of trauma on youth.

Ohio Bridges: NOAS provides services available through Bridges, a post-emancipation support program in Ohio that extends housing and other supportive services to eligible former foster youth. Bridges is administered by the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services, through a grant agreement with the Child and Family Health Collaborative of Ohio.

OhioKAN: NOAS is proud to partner with OhioKAN, a statewide flexible and responsive kinship and adoption navigator program designed to assist children, caregivers, and families.

Wendy's Wonderful Kids: NOAS is a proud partner of Wendy's Wonderful Kids, a signature program of the Dave Thomas Foundation. Wendy's Wonderful Kids Recruiters find adoptive families or permanency for foster children.





Investing in Hope

The financial overview highlights the diverse funding sources and expenditures that enabled us to achieve our mission this year. These resources reflect the generosity of our supporters, the success of our initiatives, and our commitment to fostering stability and growth for youth and families.

FUELING OUR MISSION:

Grants: Federal, state, local and private foundations fund programs and services within a community or service area.

Program Service Fees and Contracts (PSF&C): When a nonprofit charges for a service directly related to its mission, it is called program service revenue. Besides charitable gifts, it is the second most common way nonprofits make money.

Special Events: Fundraising events not only provided critical financial support but also raised awareness for the mission. Fundraising events can include concerts, silent auctions, galas, golf outings and more.

Contributions: Individual and corporate contributions continued to be a vital source of funding. The generosity of our donors directly impacted the lives of foster youth and families, ensuring they received the care and resources they need to thrive.



Foster Family Recruitment and Retention: Our Recruitment and Retention Committee worked diligently to address the statewide shortage of foster families.

By implementing targeted

marketing strategies by zip code, we successfully engaged potential foster families in areas of greatest need, expanding our capacity to support children in care.

Employee Wellness
Initiatives: The Wellness
Committee prioritized selfcare and stress relief for staff,
organizing a variety of activities
such as the NOAS Olympics,
relaxation and mindfulness
information, and a new Tell Me
Anything series, which created
an opportunity for staff to learn
new skills and hobbies. These
efforts reinforced a positive and
supportive work environment.

Angel Tree Program: The Angel Tree program brought holiday joy to foster youth by providing more than 200 Christmas gifts. This initiative, supported by generous

individuals and local businesses, highlighted the power of community in making a difference in the lives of current and former foster youth.

Recruiting Diverse Families:

NOAS staff and the newly established NOAS Diversity Advisory Council (NDAC) took meaningful steps toward enhancing diversity in foster family recruitment prioritizing recruitment of families that represent foster youth in Northeast Ohio.
