A Year In Review: Growth, Transition, and Resilience

The first part of the year was dedicated to preparing for and completing our **office relocation**. While we only moved a few suites down the plaza, the transition required thoughtful planning, coordination, and teamwork. Our new space offers a welcoming and functional environment for staff, volunteers, community partners, families, and youth. If you have not yet visited, we would be delighted to show you around.

This year also strengthened our commitment to **employee well-being**. Through our expanded Employee Wellness Initiative, we continued to emphasize work-life balance, stress management, and overall staff support. Our team is our greatest asset, and investing in their wellness ensures they can continue providing exceptional care and advocacy.

We are proud of the **strong partnerships** we built and sustained throughout the year. From new community relationships to long-standing alliances, these collaborations remain essential to our mission. Financially, NOAS is turning the corner from the multi-year placement crisis with targeted recruitment. Five successful fundraising events—made possible through significant staff effort—contributed meaningfully to our fiscal health.

Recruitment and retention efforts also evolved. Our Recruitment and Retention Committee met every other week to review new strategies, discuss challenges, and respond to the ongoing shortage of qualified foster families. These efforts resulted in the implementation of fresh tactics to engage and retain families committed to supporting youth with complex needs.

Our Young Adult Support Program continued to grow this year, both in reach and capacity. We added two new staff members to strengthen the program and better meet the needs of young adults who aged out of foster care without being adopted. Through this expanded team, participants received enhanced guidance, connection, and practical assistance—including support with rent, transportation, and unexpected expenses — helping them build stability during a critical time in their lives.

Throughout the year, the NOAS team worked tirelessly to equip foster youth with the tools, support, and relationships they need to thrive. The **dedication, compassion, and commitment** demonstrated each day remain the driving force behind our impact.

Creating a Brighter Future for Foster Youth

Every child deserves a safe, stable, and nurturing home. At NOAS, our mission is to create meaningful connections that empower youth to thrive.

Evan’s story is a shining example of how dedicated support and thoughtful advocacy can help a young person find the family, stability, and guidance they need to flourish—bringing us one step closer to creating brighter futures for foster youth.

In spring 2024, I had my first visit with Evan and his foster family as his Wendy’s Wonderful Kids Recruiter. Evan is a bright, caring, and creative child who enjoys karate, drawing, and exploring his artistic talents. During our first visit, he even shared a drawing he had made just for me.

As we got to know each other, Evan mentioned that he keeps in touch with his uncle, Calvin, and expressed interest in being adopted by him. I reached out to Evan’s county worker and, with permission, connected with Calvin. He was thrilled at the opportunity and eager to begin the adoption process.

By summer 2024, Evan and Calvin were visiting regularly, including overnights during the holidays. Over the next few months, Evan and I talked about adoption and the importance of maintaining his positive routines as he prepared for this next chapter.

In early 2025, Calvin was granted legal custody of Evan.

During my final visit, we shared lunch and conversation, celebrating Evan’s new chapter. Evan happily shared that he was excited to be with his uncle and have other nearby family members in his life. He even asked for a hug before I left—a small moment that reflected a big milestone.

I am overjoyed that Evan was able to reunite with family and begin a stable, loving chapter in his life.

Programs in Action: Creating Lasting Impact

The following programs are offered at no cost to our families to provide support, foster meaningful connections, and help create brighter futures for current and former foster youth.

Foster Care

Our foster care program helps children who have been removed from their homes through no fault of their own find safe, stable, and nurturing environments. By recruiting, training, and supporting dedicated foster families, we create meaningful connections that inspire hope and help children build brighter futures. Foster care often leads to adoption creating permanency for children.

Trauma-Informed Programs

Our trauma-informed training programs equip caregivers and professionals with practical tools and strategies to understand and respond to the impact of trauma, helping youth build resilience, emotional well-being, and brighter futures.

Ohio Bridges

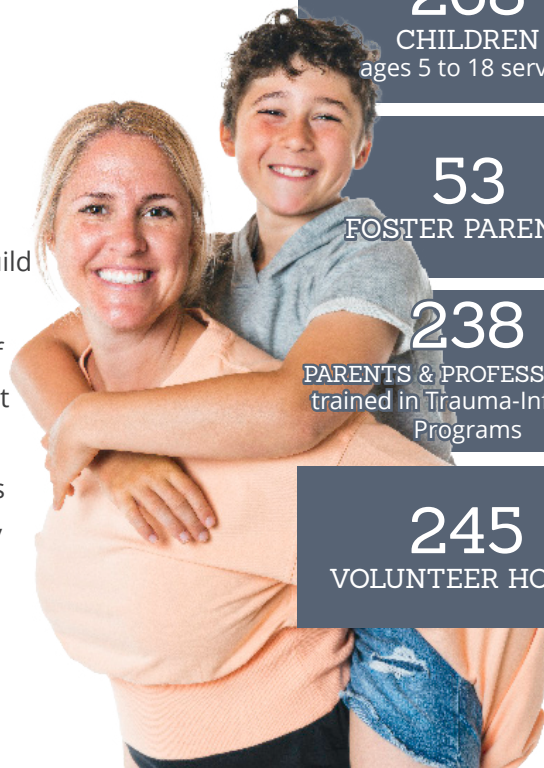
Through Bridges, NOAS provides housing and supportive services to help eligible former foster youth build stability and independence. Administered by the Department of Children and Youth, through a grant with the Child and Family Health Collaborative of Ohio, Bridges helps young adults transition successfully and create brighter futures.

OhioKAN

NOAS is proud to partner with OhioKAN, a statewide kinship and adoption navigator program that supports children, caregivers, and families. This partnership helps families access resources, guidance, and connections, ensuring youth have the support they need to thrive and build brighter futures.

Wendy's Wonderful Kids

NOAS is proud to partner with Wendy's Wonderful Kids, a signature program of the Dave Thomas Foundation. Our dedicated recruiters work tirelessly to connect foster children with loving adoptive families, helping youth achieve permanency, stability, and brighter futures.
